ASK GOD FOR WISDOM TO APPLY HIS WORD IN OUR DAILY LIVES

What does God want us to desire/value?	What does God want us to know?	What does God want us to do?
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1. **Read Habakkuk 3:1-2.** What did Habakkuk want to see revived? How does God make His glory known to men in our day? What are we praying for when we ask God to send revival? When God has sent revival, where does it typically begin?
2. **Read Zechariah 1:1-3; Jeremiah 4:1; Hosea 6:1.** What does it mean to return to the Lord? What needed to change in among this restored remnant? How do we turn away from the Lord so that we need to return?
3. What does God promise to His repentant people? How can we enjoy the presence of God? What does it look like when God's people are enjoying His presence?
4. **Read Zechariah 1:4-6.** What did false repentance look like in Israel? How did they fail to hear from God? What does God ask their fathers and the prophets? Did God keep His promise to judge Israel for their lack of genuine repentance?
5. What are the characteristics of genuine repentance? What is the difference between being sorry and being repentant? What took place when those in captivity actually repented?
6. **Read 2 Peter 1:2-4.** Examine Peter's prayer and consider how his prayer should inform our praying for one another? What does Peter tell us about God's promises (i.e. their character)? How do we treat things that are precious to us? Why has God given us His promises? What is their purpose and how does this happen?
7. **Read Zechariah 1:7-17; 18-21.** What promises are highlighted in these two visions? Why does God give them such promises? How does God's promise of future blessing impact our present circumstances? What promises are precious to you?
8. **Read Zechariah 2:1-13; 3:1-10.** What promises are highlighted in these two visions? Why were they to sing for joy and be glad? When will this take place? Why do we wait to sing and be glad? Can God's promise fail?
9. **Read Zechariah 4:1-14; 5:1-4.** What promises are highlighted in these two visions?
10. **Read Zechariah 5:5-11; 6:1-8.** What promises are highlighted in these two visions?
